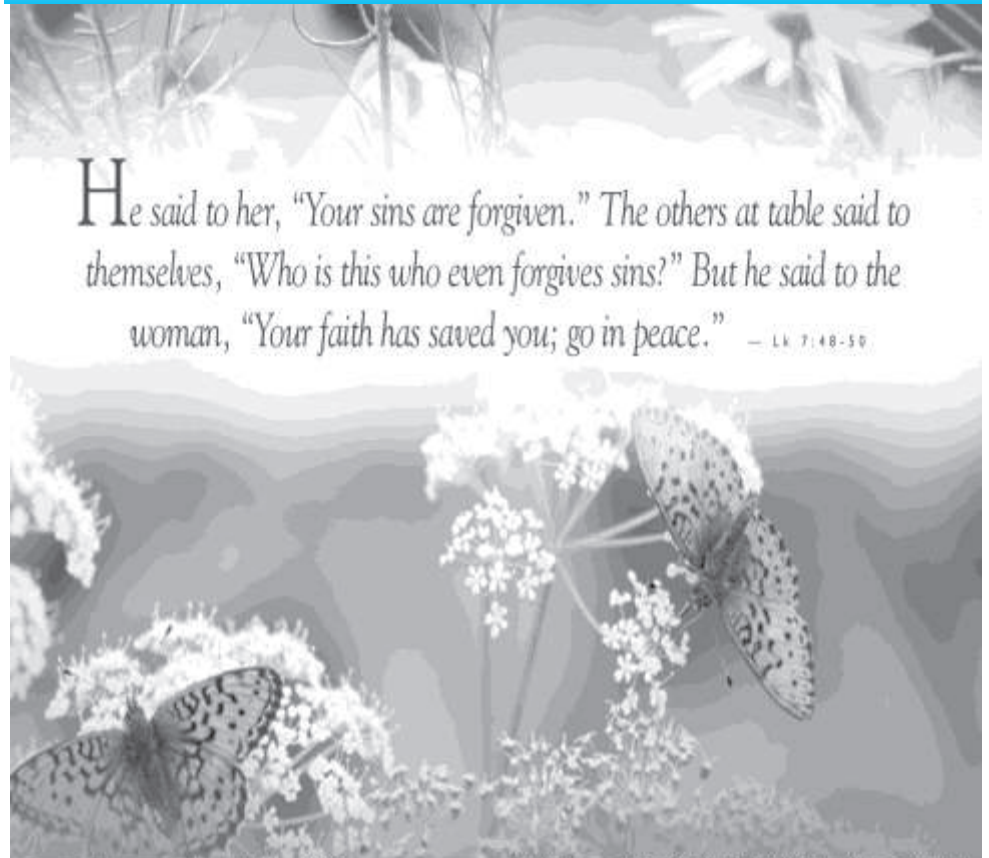

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We'd like our children to be perfect angels. As parents, we spend a lot of time teaching them proper manners, coaching them on moral behavior, and helping them understand right from wrong. And while we would like everything they do to be good and right, we know that sometimes our sons and daughters have to learn from their mistakes. We just hope and pray that the mistakes in their lives are minor and give them an education, as opposed to serious problems that lead to calamitous results. Sometimes, as parents, we have to take a stand (tough love, some call it) as a way of holding firm to certain principles of behavior.

The woman in the Gospel today is described as a sinner, although Luke never specifies the actual sin. We like to imagine the worst—adultery, harlotry. Maybe we do that because if she's guilty of really awful sins (after all, Jesus said that her many sins were forgiven), then she's not quite like us. We can stand on the side of righteousness—just like the Pharisee! (Whoops! Is that really the side we want to be on?)

Well, yes, it is. We do want to be on the side of righteousness. But we don't want to be on the side of self-righteousness. That is the delicate balance that each of us must strike. When our own children behave badly, we have to be prepared with correction. But we also have to be ready with forgiveness. Mercy is also one of the certain principles of Christian life. And just as God's justice is tempered with eternal mercy, so must our own desire for the right be guided by a merciful love. It's not always an easy balance to strike, but as we'll hear throughout this year as we read from Luke's Gospel, God's mercy is without limit or end.

State of the Parish Update

Back in April, we sent out a state of the parish update

to inform our parish families of the financial situation at church. Thank you to everyone who responded to our letter with an increased offering and those who expressed concern regarding our financial health. All comments are welcome and taken into consideration by our Finance Council for future planning. We appreciate the continued generosity of our parish family through time, talent, and treasure.

If our adult weekly giving continues at the current weekly average of just over \$14,000/week, we should end the current fiscal year in the black by a few hundred dollars. This is no small feat! We worked very hard to trim costs where possible throughout the year. And, without your **support, we wouldn't be able to continue to grow as a faith community.**

We have some major projects happening this summer. First, we have the bids in on repairing the Parish Center and Narthex roof. We are hoping to be able to begin work by the first of July.

Secondly, the air compressor on our A/C unit has once again burnt out. Luckily, there should be minimal costs to replace the unit this year, as it was still covered under warranty. A sub-committee has been formed between the Finance Council and Buildings and Grounds to review all of our major systems and develop a long-range plan for maintenance and replacement. One of the first things they will be looking into is whether or not the air conditioning system should be replaced.

And finally, the Pastoral Council has set their priorities for the upcoming fiscal year. This year we will focus on hospitality and fellowship. In addition, a faith formation task force is being formed, we will conduct a parish census this summer, and work on growing our baptismal preparation program.

A final year-end report, 10-11 budget, giving statement, and census form will be mailed in mid-July. In the meantime, if you have any questions, please give the office or any of the Finance Council members a call.

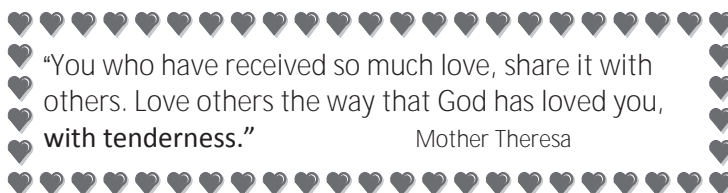

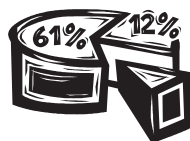

He was fitted with artificial arms but disposed of them when he was ten. "I didn't feel comfortable," he explains, "I could use my feet so much better."
